THE SOCIAL PRACTICE LAB.

The Social Practice Lab mission is to invest resources in underserved communities in order to address and resolve the health equity gap. We envision a robust public health infrastructure where every community has access to equitable healthcare. Social Practice Lab is bringing life-changing projects to residents in deep poverty pockets throughout the Louisville Community.

The Social Practice Lab's core program is the Harm Reduction Hub, a public health collaborative work space, well positioned to provide barrier-free, comprehensive prevention and treatment services to underserved Louisville residents. Louisville Metro Public Health and Wellness is partnering with The Social Practice Lab to expand harm reduction services to the Shelby Park neighborhood. The location was chosen as 40203 is the number one zip code for EMS runs in response to overdoses. Thus far in 2022, The Social Practice Lab has had 6,913 total participant interactions, 786 in October alone.

Our objectives include:

- Provide barrier-free access to comprehensive prevention & healthcare services
- Decrease HIV and HCV transmission rates
- Decrease overdose and overdose death rates
- Increase retention in care and treatment services
